Quorum was present at the meeting.

A motion to approve the minutes from the January 23, 2024 meeting was made by Lewis Wolfe. Second by Chairman Jarvis. Motion approved.

Chairman Jarvis introduced the guests who were in attendance. Kerry Fryman, Ronnie Flerlage, Darin Dillon, and Daniel Rehner were there to represent Limestone Farms.

Availability Requests were next.

There was one (1) request on the agenda.

- 1. Limestone Farms Distillery WWTP#1.
 - Kerry Fryman, Ronnie Flerlage, Darin Dillon, and Daniel Rehner were representing the project. A motion to approve the availability request made by Glenn Williams, subject to the conditions contained in the memorandum and with additional contingencies mentioned below. Second by Jeff Klocke. Motion approved. The contingencies that were added are as follows:
 - -The developer, through and during the engineering review process, must demonstrate sanitary sewer discharge will be less than or equal to a volume of 2,000 gallons per day. Flow meter to be provided by Limestone.
 - -The property must be annexed into the City of Georgetown within 6 months of this approval.

- Discussion regarding the Water Treatment Plant Unregulated Contaminant Monitoring Rule 5 was presented by Chase Azevedo. Adam Terry and Tim Geneve, both from GMWSS Water Treatment, also provided information throughout.

- 3. Jason Baird presented a Legislative Update regarding House Bill 1 and House Bill 6. One of Jason's clients is the Kentucky Municipal Utility Partnership which is under the umbrella of the Kentucky League of Cities.
